MINUTES OF 39th MEETING OF SENATE HELD ON 17TH DECEMBER 2019

The 39th meeting of Senate was held on 17th December 2019 at 3.00 PM in Malaviya Sabhagar, Prabha Bhawan of the Institute. At the outset, the Director & Chairman Senate welcomed to all Senators. As per guidelines stipulated in the UG regulations, all students are required to register in person for each semester for the courses to be pursued by them, as per the programme, on the dates specified in the Academic Calendar. The sole responsibility for registration rests with the student concerned. A student is required to register in person each semester for the courses that he/she intends to pursue in that semester.</p> <p>Academic Section sent letters and email to the all inactive students on ERP and also to their parents. Students were warned of the consequences of non adherence to the instructions, it was intimated to the students that action as per the guidelines stipulated in UG Rules & Regulations No. 14 would be initiated against them i.e. they would be terminated from Institute rolls.</p> <p>The following students failed to report and register by the last date of registration for more than two semesters. "Academic Performance Requirement" and sub clause:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The minimum CGPA requirement for continuing and getting assistantship in M. Tech./M. Plan./MBA programme is 6.0 3. If a M. Tech./M. Plan./MBA student secures a CGPA between 5.0 and 6.0 she/he may be allowed to continue in the next semester on the recommendation of the DPGC and with the approval of the SPGB.
